

Plumeria Cutting Instructions

Please read this entire page and if you have questions please call Fernando at 714-478-8638. Keep cuttings in a shady place until you are ready to plant it. Do NOT leave in the sun.

Planting

Insert cutting into cactus mix soil making sure that it is deep enough to stand sturdy but not touching the bottom of the pot. The pot should not be oversized. Most cuttings should be started in a 1 gallon sized pot. Pack the soil tightly around the cutting. Cuttings should then be placed in filtered sun to root and not be disturbed.

Watering

Water lightly, 1 cup every 7 days throughout the rooting process which can take up to 90 days. Depending on the area and temperature of which you live, watering may need to be done more or less frequently. Red plumeria cuttings take longer to root. Watering should be done early morning or late afternoon.

Rooted

Plumeria cuttings are rooted when the new leaves are 4 to 5 inches long. Once rooted, change the watering to a good soak about every 5 days depending on where you live. Rule of thumb soak plumeria then rewater when the soil is completely dry. Do not over water, they prefer to be on the dry side. Fertilize your rooted plant once a month with a high phosphorus fertilizer.
